# Trustee Report – Shali Baziuk

- Enrollment up 3.8% 28,000 students in the school division
- 1052 students joined RVS this year
- Significant Challenges: Space in our already full schools, modular classrooms
- Modular Units:
  - RCE: 14 modulars, space for 2 more
  - $\circ$   $\,$  CLMS: 11 modulars with 4 more estimated by end of October 2023; at maximum built out
  - $\circ$  CHS: modulars there will not be attached to the school, no bathrooms or sinks
- School Sites: update from the City of Chestermere; Earthworks is being moved on the high school site, land titles will be applied for transfer

# RAINBOW CREEK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL COUNCIL

- October/November meet with the school division to review priorities
- Provincial government will not give money for a school without a school site ready to put a school on. Needs to be shovel ready
- 1 other school site ready in the school division and that is Airdrie, if the high school site is ready it might look promising
- Chestermere needs a new school; however, it will take 3 years to build, modulars required in the meantime
- Langdon Jr/Sr high school to open September 2024. Approx 300 kids from CHS will go to the Langdon school, but Chestermere will probably have that amount of kids new to the school that year
- If enough Chestermere students want to go to Langdon High School RVS will offer a bus to take the students from Chestermere to Langdon
- Options: Grades 7-11 or 9-11; all the options are on the table
- Ask the students what they want to do for high school or if there are other options for them
- If there is the option for Chestermere kids to go to Langdon school it will be for all of Chestermere, not just one community of Chestermere
- September 27th at 630pm School Council Orientation
- Capital Priorities list currently priority 1-4 (2023) Chestermere k-9
- Chestermere High school priority 11
- Continued advocacy continue to ask the city to get the school sites ready
- Early next year (spring) going to start talking about a grade/boundary reconfiguration to inform the board's decision
- Capital Plan will be attached to the report

RVS Trustee report for School council September

## ENROLMENT

Enrolment in RVS Schools Climbs 3.8 per cent

Students returned to classrooms across  $\overline{\text{RVS}}$  the week of Sept. 5 – early enrolment numbers indicate an additional 1,052 students joined the division.

RVS is required to submit its enrolment total as of Sept. 30 to the Government of Alberta. Total enrolment as of Sept. 6 is 28,664; however, it is important to note this number will continue to flex both up to and after the Sept. 30 deadline. We welcome all new students and those returning to our schools this September.

While enrolment growth is positive, it continues to pose significant challenges in two vital areas: - space in already full to over-full schools while we wait for new schools to be funded and built and for more modular classrooms -inequities created by the Weighted Moving Average funding model, which underfunds growing school divisions. For RVS, this funding model means around 800 students will not be funded by the provincial government this school year. More information on these advocacy priorities is available on the RVS website.

RVS will host a school grade and boundary configuration consultation on October 17<sup>th</sup> in Langdon. Chestermere families are welcome to attend and/or provide feedback through the RVS Engage link that can be found on our Web site.

## SCHOOL SITES

An update was received from Travis Fillier, the Director of Planning at the City of Chestermere regarding the high school site. Travis is confident the high school site will have title transferred to RVS within 2 months.
