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2. PBIS Update

We have officially created our first school-wide matrix, from melding the voices and ideas of our staff, student, and parents' population. Keeping our schools name in mind, we have matched our rainbow theme, and created an "ARCS" matrix, which focuses on being Accountable, Responsible, Caring, and Safe. To help begin these conversations, we created a bulletin board that helps depict where these values live within our school. Our next steps as a committee are to begin teaching out the lessons that match our values. We will be starting with our "Safe" value, hosting a division-based assembly in the middle of April, to begin a conversation with students about what safety looks like, feels like, and sounds like at Rainbow Creek.
